## School and Community

El Camino High School (ECHS) is a comprehensive high school for grades 9-12 that serves a community that is economically, culturally and ethnically diverse in North San Diego County. ECHS is one of two comprehensive high schools in the Oceanside Unified School District and the second largest high school in San Diego County serving approximately 2800 students.

## Student Life

El Camino High School encourages students to develop into well-rounded individuals by providing a wide variety of activities to its students. In addition to an active Associate Student Body, award-winning music programs (choral, jazz band, marching band and orchestras), drama and a full range of competitive athletics in the Avocado League, El Camino students have the opportunity to participate in over 50 clubs, including Speech & Debate, Model UN, Robotix, STEM Club, Girls Learn International, Coding Club, ACE Mentorship, Key Club, GSA Pride, Best Buddies, NAMU, French Honor Society and Junior Civitan Club.

## Grading System

Grade Point Average of students is calculated using the letter grade system in a 4 point scale. Advanced Placement and college courses numbered 100 or above are given an additional point for weighing the GPA. All semester grades earned during grades 9-12 are included in the graduation GPA.

Virtual learning during the Covid-19 pandemic impacted the grading policy for the second semester of the 2019-20 school year and students' grades were adjusted to Credit/No Credit.

## School Schedule and COVID Interruptions

El Camino High School follows a semester schedule from August to June. Students have the opportunity to enroll in 6 classes, which they attend Monday through Friday for approximately an hour each day.

Due to COVID, El Camino High School closed its campus in March 2020. During school closure, students participated in a remote-learning model where students participated in all classes on-line under teacher direction. Starting in March 2021, ECHS moved to a hybrid model, in which students attended classes virtually 1 day per week in person 2 days per week, and participated in independent learning 2 days per week.
